2022 ERWC Literacy Conference

Calling all ERWC teachers, coaches, and workshop leaders!

Have you been using ERWC 3.0 in your classroom or do you work with educators who use ERWC? If so, we want to hear from you! The 2022 ERWC Literacy Conference will showcase best practices for effective implementation of the third edition of the curriculum. We especially invite teachers who have been using ERWC 3.0 modules with designated English language development to share what they've learned about how to make the curriculum and its culturally and linguistically pedagogies work for their students. Sessions focused on specific modules, pathways, or pairings are particularly welcome. Proposals may address any of the following topics:

- Designing a cohesive year-long course
- Modifying instruction in response to student needs, goals, and interests
- Creating equitable learning environments and experiences
- Promoting reflection and goal setting
- Pairing modules and minis
- Teaching modules with Integrated and Designated English Language Development
- Making instructional decisions based on Universal Design for Learning
- Supporting student writers through ERWC 3.0
- Practicing formative assessment for learning and transfer
- Facilitating productive classroom discussions
- Supporting students in using genre knowledge for reading and writing
- Rhetorical literacies and learning
- Culturally sustaining pedagogies
- Removing scaffolding and fostering independence
- Embedding CAASPP-style questions into modules
- Teaching ERWC in hybrid and virtual settings

Concurrent break-out sessions will be 75 minutes long.

The deadline is 11:59 p.m., April 1, 2022.

Please use the link below to submit proposals of 300-500 words. Include a brief curriculum vitae highlighting your ERWC experience with your submission. Travel expenses and conference registration for presenters will be paid by the California State University. Please be sure your proposal is based on the final, published modules under the 3.0 tab in the ERWC Online Community. You will be notified of the status of your proposal by April 30, 2022.

Call for Presenters, Continued

Because of limited time slots and potential duplicate topics, proposals will be competitively selected by the ERWC Steering Committee. Proposals accepted for the conference program will demonstrate the following characteristics:

- Alignment to ERWC 3.0's key principles and practices, including assets-based instruction and culturally sustaining pedagogies
- Clear objectives that are relevant to ERWC course design
- Depth of ERWC expertise and experience
- Attention to deepening student learning
- Focus on ERWC texts/modules rather than supplemental materials
- Active and appropriate engagement of participants
- An inquiry-based approach
